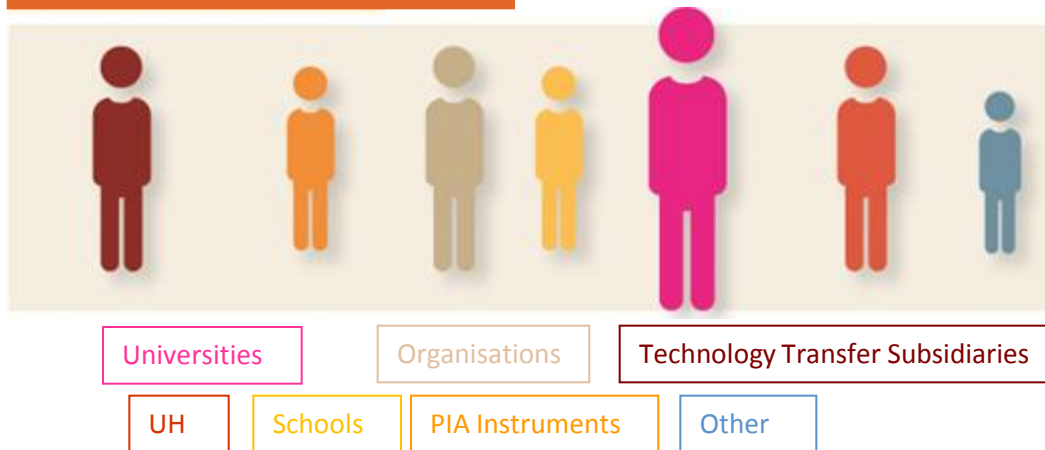

An extensive ecosystem of French Research that has gradually developed with technology transfer structures relying on:

Universities; Research organisations (CEA, INSERM, CNRS, INRIA, INRA, ONERA); UH, Grandes Ecoles, SATT network, Technology Research Institutes, UHI

The network acts as coordinator and facilitator for all the professionals in these transfer structures through:

dialogue with Ministries and Institutions (Bpifrance, INPI, ANR)

promotion, development and professionalization of Technology Transfer

interfacing with the socio-economic world: Intellectual Property firms, technology marketing consultants, manufacturers

Providing and sharing services with members:

training, operational tools, job boards, technology exchange, indicators

Click & Co-lab’: a skills research service allowing manufacturers to identify in public laboratories the skills they need to carry out their project

National survey: Indicators of valorisation – year 2014



- Total amount of research contract bills: **959 M €**
- Number of primary patent applications (whose management and valorisation are covered by the institution): **1 571**
- Number of issued patents (whose management and valorisation are covered by the institution): **3 520**
- Number of contracts relevant to the exploitation of intellectual property signed by the institution in 2014: **1 709**
- Total revenue from contracts relevant to exploitation of intellectual property in 2014: **145 millions d'€**
- Total number of companies created: **303**
- Amount of the fund-raising generated by the spin-offs (i.e. the start-ups coming from the valorisation structure): **164 millions d'€.**
